

The Advent Wreath: First Sunday of advent

Today we light the first candle of the Advent wreath. Each candle has a meaning. This first candle is hope.

Advent 1 [26 (A&M 2013)]

Advent candles tell their story as we watch and pray; longing for the Day of Glory, 'Come, Lord, soon,' we say. Pain and sorrow, tears and sadness Changed for gladness on that Day.

The candle is lit.

"We wait in hope for the Lord; he is our help and our shield." (Psalm 33:20)

Eternal God, as we await the coming of our saviour, give us the courage to hope. Give us grace to see your plans of redemption for our lives, for this community, and for the world, through Jesus Christ, the source of our redemption and hope. **Amen**.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

First Reading Jeremiah 33.23-26

The word of the Lord came to Jeremiah: Have you not observed how these people say, 'The two families that the Lord chose have been rejected by him', and how they hold my people in such contempt that they no longer regard them as a nation? 'There will be signs in the sun, the moon, and the stars, and on the earth distress among nations confused by the roaring of the sea and the waves. People will faint from fear and foreboding of what is coming upon the world, for the powers of the heavens will be shaken. Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in a cloud" with power and great glory. Now when these things begin to take place, stand up and raise your heads, because your redemption is drawing near.'

Then he told them a parable: 'Look at the fig tree and all the trees; as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near. Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

'Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man.'

Every day he was teaching in the temple, and at night he would go out and spend the night on the Mount of Olives, as it was called. And all the people would get up early in the morning to listen to him in the temple.

ADVENT AT THE CATHEDRAL

Today we commence a new Church Year, with the season of Advent.

Advent extends across the four Sundays prior to Christmas.

The liturgical colour for Advent is purple, representing the call of God's kingdom on our lives, as purple was associated with the Emperor in Ancient Rome.



A common symbol for Advent is the advent wreath with its four coloured candles and a central white candle. As we light each successive candle at the first service of week, we offer prayers for different spiritual blessings.




CHRISTMAS BOWL
