Bible verse: - Matthew 9:9-13



He saw the person that Matthew could be, and so Jesus asked Matthew to follow him, to be one of his closest friends. Jesus still calls people today. Matthew did so well as one of Jesus' friends that one of the books in the New Testament Bible is named after him. Many people believe that he may have played a part in writing it himself.


