PARISH FINANCES DURING THE PANDEMIC

The following is an extract from the Treasurer's report to Parish Council when it met by Zoom last month:

The shutdown of Church services, the Opshop and to some extent the Bookshop has had a major impact on our income. This is only partly evident in the March figures and will be even starker from April onwards.

Church offerings are down by nearly \$3,000 on budget and the Opshop down by nearly \$2,000. On the positive side there has been a significant increase in Parish Provider offerings and this will likely increase now that the Dean's letter to parishioners has been sent. However, there is likely to be some "shrinkage" over what was normally received by way of traditional offerings.

Most importantly there has been a major increase in donations, some very large, and when combined with fundraising whether it be via selling mangoes, furniture or something else has increased our income by around \$55,000 for the month. We are very grateful to the donors, many of whom wish to remain anonymous. It is unrealistic to imagine that donations and fundraising will remain at this level, but they will probably be higher than usual.

As mentioned in the extract from the Treasurer's report, it has been pleasing to see a number of parishioners move from offering envelopes to direct giving through the <u>Parish Provider</u> program operated through Anglican Funds Grafton Diocese. Other people have begun to use our <u>mobile giving facility</u> through the Cathedral app, and this is also most welcome. Thank you as well to all those who make a special trip to the office every week or so to drop off their offering envelopes. If you would like to continue with envelope giving the new envelopes starting at the beginning of June are available from the office. Together we are going to ensure that the mission and ministry of the Cathedral is sustained in these tough times.

CATHEDRAL PANTRY

Our emergency food pantry has now been operating for about a month and is providing an important service to those who have been badly affected by the current COVID-19 pandemic. The pantry is coordinated by Moe Jones, assisted by a small team of volunteers. For now the Pantry operates three half days each week (Mon & Tue morning plus Thr afternoons), but may soon extend those hours or even begin to operate the Pantry from inside the OpShop so that we can resume a low level of activity through the OpShop as winter approaches. If you know of people who are having trouble accessing the shops for essential household items or non-perishable food, please let us know. If people are house bound we can arrange a delivery to them.

UPDATE ON CHURCH CLOSURES DURING THE PANDEMIC

We expect all churches will remain closed until at least the end of June, and even then it is likely that there will be strict limits on the number of people allowed inside the Cathedral as well as advice for vulnerable people to avoid such gatherings.

TECHNOLOGY UPGRADES FOR SOCIAL MEDIA MINISTRY

Parish Council has approved plans for a major investment in technology to ensure we can offer professional live streaming for regular services and special events, including funerals and weddings. Total cost is around \$50,000.

In the first instance, we shall draw on trust funds for most of those costs, but we would welcome contributions from parishioners and from friends farther afield.

If you value our live-streamed services, please consider making a gift. You can send a cheque or use our mobile giving facility.

The first phase will be upgrade the audio, and those changes were made this past week. Total cost \$2,000. Low hanging fruit. Let's fully fund that phase immediately with special gifts.

In successive phases of the project we shall improve the lighting and then install remote controlled pan/tilt/zoom IP cameras, as well as an audio and video control desk.

We know that COVID19 will trigger significant long-term changes to the way we pursue our core mission as a generous faith community centred on Jesus, seeking wisdom for life, and acting with compassion—in the heart of Grafton since 1842 ... and now wherever the Internet allows us to reach.

As an innovative faith community we are embracing the opportunities provided by technology to exercise a wide and inclusive ministry, and we appreciate your engagement with us as we do that.
