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Ritual Matters

- Ritual enriches the everyday
- Identifies points of significance
- Reinforces things that matter to us
- May have developed from practical needs long ago
- But now have a deep significance
- Lighting a candle

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- Rituals can become stale
- Participants may not 'appreciate' them
- As time passes they cease to function
- May not resonate in different cultural contexts
- But they remain part of public & private life
- Crown - Parliament - Courts - Church - Military - Home

Culture and Spirit

- Reflect on interaction of culture and faith
- Religion and politics always mix
- Our sense of the sacred is embedded in culture
- A fish may not see the water
- We may not see the cultural elements of our worship
- We may be offended by new cultural forms in worship





The baby and the bathwater

The principles are reasonably clear:

- Humans are creatures of ritual and pattern
- Some rituals and symbols are 'primal'
- Others are transitional
- Some are retained beyond their usefulness
- Some retain their power to draw us deeper
- All benefit from intentionality
- How to keep the baby while discarding the bath water?


- Fire

- Sacred times





Formative influences


- Ancient Jewish & pagan temples

- Monasteries and Cathedrals





















The Shape of our Liturgy

- ### Beware the assumptions
- Especially the unspoken ones
- Most prominent sacred object?
 - Catholic/Orthodox - Altar
 - Protestant - Pulpit
 - Methodist - Organ
 - Baptist/Churches of Christ - Baptistry
 - Pentecostal - Stage

- ### Basic liturgical shape
- Gathering
 - Scripture
 - Teaching
 - Prayer
 - Sacramental Action
 - Dispersal
-

- GATHERING RITE
 - LITURGY OF THE WORD
 - PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL
 - LITURGY OF THE TABLE
 - BLESSING & DISMISSAL

The shape of the Eucharist

GATHERING RITE

- Entrance of the Choir & Clergy
- Greetings & Call to Worship
- Reconciliation
- Song of Praise
- Collect (Prayer of the Day)

The shape of the Eucharist

LITURGY OF THE WORD

- First Reading (usually from Old Testament)
- Canticle or Psalm in response
- Second Reading (from the Apostles)
- Gospel
- Sermon
- Creed

The shape of the Eucharist

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

- Prayers for the world and the church
- Prayers for special local needs
- Recognition of ministry
- Reconciliation, if not done earlier
- The Pax

The shape of the Eucharist

LITURGY OF THE TABLE

- Pax
- Offertory
- Great Thanksgiving Prayer
- Lord's Prayer
- Anthems (Agnus dei, etc)
- Holy Communion
- Post-Communion Prayers

The shape of the Eucharist

SENT FORTH ON MISSION

- Notices
- Blessing
- Dismissal
- Departure of the Choir & Clergy

Decorating our liturgy

- The basic shape or structure is the same
- But seasonal variations
- Liturgical seasons and holy days
- Readings from the lectionary cycle
- Music from the repertoire of hymns old and new
- Intros and anthems from repertoire of Choir
- Sermons by the assigned preacher of the day

Hearts and lips together

- What matters most
- Not the ritual
- Not the eloquence of the preacher
- Not the skill of the choir and musicians
- But the hearts of the participants
